2018-19 Policies

Dues:

Dues cover Scouts BSA membership, Pack t-shirt (class B uniform), and awards such as badges, pins, and belt loops. Dues do not cover Class A uniforms, Den books, and additional activity costs. The Due structure is as follows-

- New Scouts: \$75.00 to pay for remainder of 2018 and for calendar year 2019 (December to December, payable to Pack at signup). BSA charges \$2.75/month for membership. Annually, this comes out to a BSA charge of \$33. The remaining difference goes towards a Pack t-shirt for each scout, and various awards throughout the year.
- **Returning Scouts**: \$65.00 to pay for the 2019 calendar year (December to December, payable to Pack by October 1st for Re-charter) with the annual charges of \$33 for BSA. The remaining difference goes towards a Pack t-shirt and various awards throughout the year.

Boys Life Magazine:

An optional subscription to Boys Life Magazine (the official magazine for Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts) is \$16.00 for new scouts (Covers the remainder of 2018 and all of 2019) and \$12.00 for returning scouts (all of 2019). Payment for subscription is due with payment of new scout or renewal dues.

Campouts:

Campout costs typically are \$20 per family (dependent on location and number of participants) this pays for a campsite for each family and typically includes a Pack prepared dinner and breakfast on the last day of camp.

Scout Shirts:

Scout shirts will be ordered in Sept for delivery by the beginning of October. Every scout is required to have a T Shirt. Additional shirts will be available for the cost per item and paid before ordering. (extra for XXL, XXXL, etc).

Health Forms:

All scouts, siblings and parents going on outings away from our Primary Meeting location need to have their health forms completed and on file with the pack. Health Forms need to be updated annually if there is any change in your Scouts health status. Health forms will be updated in August/September.

Adults

All active adults, 18 and older, participating with scouts need to have Youth Protection Training. Cub Scouts are a family event and Scouts are encouraged to have a Parent or Guardian participating at all activities.

Training:

Den leaders need to have the following training: • This is Scouting • Youth Protection Training • Leader Specific Fast Start • Leader Specific Training • BALOO – Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation • Hazardous Weather (recommended) • Outdoor Leadership Skills for Webelos (Webelos Leaders)

Committee Members need to have the following training: • This is Scouting • Youth Protection Training • Pack Committee Fast Start • Pack Committee Specific

Parent Assistance with each event:

We request involvement in planning/organizing or helping out with at least one event or activity during the year.

Popcorn Sales:

All scouts should participate in at least one Show & Sell to fundraise for awards and activities. 30% of popcorn sales are retained by the Pack to pay for activities throughout the year. 5% to 6% of popcorn sales profits will be set aside for prizes. • The Pack will pre-buy approximately \$5,000 worth of product for Show & Sell events. Show and Sells will occur at the following locations ♦ Best Buy Market ♦ CVS or other suitable locations in Hanford. Unsold inventory will be used to fill orders before sheet orders are submitted to council. • All money is due at time of order pickup or popcorn will not be distributed. • Money will be collected, and Order sheets will be copied weekly. • Pack will be done with 2018 popcorn sales no later than the last date to pay council for bonus commission. • Webelo scouts advancing to Boy Scouts in February will have 50% of their portion of the popcorn sale money transferred to the Troop Account if they join a Boy Scout Troop.
